Introduction: As part of our Climate Action Week Live Lessons 2025, we invite schools and nurseries from across Scotland to work together to collectively help reduce our greenhouse gas emissions.

Introduction

This September, as part of Climate Action Week, we are asking schools and nurseries to take simple actions that will help reduce greenhouse gas emissions. By working together, we can make a big collective impact and build lasting habits.

Encourage your pupils, families, and wider school community to choose from our list of actions, collect Climate Action Points while reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

Entering the prize draw

The competition part of this activity has now closed, but you can still take part in the activity to reduce your greenhouse gas emissions.

Collecting Climate Action Points

The aim of the activity is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by doing actions that are climate friendly and gaining as many Climate Action Points as possible.

You can modify the climate actions to make them more accessible for your pupils if needed.

You can keep track of your points by using the table on Page 3 (English) or Page 4 (Gaelic).

Rules for points

1. Points are per person.
2. Points can be gained each time an action is done.
3. Family, carers, and community members can gain points for your setting by completing the actions.
4. You can only gain points for actions that are different from your normal routine. For example, if you already walk to school, you cannot get points for travelling actively to school.

Climate action points

Category	Climate action	Points per action
Energy	Turn off all non-essential electrical items* for one day	1
	Turn off all hot water taps after use for one day	1
Food	Swap one meat based meal to a meat free option	1
	No food going to waste at the end of a meal	1
Active travel	Walk, scoot or cycle to nursery/school instead of using a car	2
	Use public transport for a journey instead of using a car	1
Reduce waste	Swap or repair an item rather than buying something new	2

*Non-essential electrical items = anything which is turned on when it does not need to be, e.g. smartboard when not in use, lights when classroom not in use / bright outside, TV when not being watched.

Next steps

Keep up the good work of reducing your greenhouse gas emissions by turning your climate actions into long term habits.

Use your voices to share any benefits you identified with others to encourage them to join in.
