



### [Gaelic voice at Rubha nan Gall Lighthouse](#) (English example entry)

Rubha nan Gall means “Stranger’s Point” in Gaelic. It shows how our language is linked to the places around us. The lighthouse there uses solar power, which is good for the planet, and its Gaelic name reminds us of local culture. When you walk along the long path north of Tobermory, you can enjoy the fresh air and look out for seabirds, porpoises, and seals. By looking after places like this, we protect nature (nàdar) and our Gaelic heritage (ar dualchas Gàidhlig).
