An award-winning community park for wildlife, Ian Talboys, Ury Riverside Park SCIO, Aberdeenshire **47mins40sec – 57mins39sec**

Winner of this year's Climate and Nature Friendly Communities Network 'Gardening for Wildlife Award', Ury Riverside Park is a 61ha community park for people and wildlife to enjoy together. The Park is being developed by the community for the community from a former barley field to create somewhere special for wildlife and people. A great place to walk, jog, volunteer to help create habitats or watch wildlife.
