Keep Scotland Beautiful support and resources

Our Climate and Nature Friendly Communities Network

We support, recognise and celebrate approximately 250 groups across Scotland every year through our Climate and Nature Friendly Communities Network, which includes our Beautiful Scotland and It's Your Neighbourhood initiatives. Mentor support

Your group will be visited by one of our trained volunteer assessors/mentors at some point between April and the end of September - you and our volunteer will work out a time that suits you best, and visits should be around 1 hour. The visit is informal and is a chance for you to show our volunteer around your project and for them to ask questions about e.g. who is involved, who benefits from the project, and any future plans, etc. Our volunteer then writes up a report, which we will email to you, highlighting achievements and also giving useful suggestions and advice.

It's Your Neighbourhood is non-competitive, and projects are not assessed against each other, so the visit should be enjoyable for you, the group, and our volunteer, and at no time should you feel stressed or under pressure.

If your group needs advice at any point during the year e.g. what to plant in a particular location, how best to attract volunteers, [drop us an email](#) and we can link you up with one of our volunteers, put you in touch with an experienced group who can share their experiences, or can signpost you to the relevant information.

We're always on the lookout for new volunteer assessors - if you love Scotland, the environment, gardening, meeting new people, visiting inspiring projects, and being part of a team, and want to support our aim to make Scotland clean, green and more sustainable, [get in touch](#).
