Global Citizenship Starts With A Face... Additional resources by Nicola Davies

Here you will find some follow up activities and links to resources written and shared by author especially for this lesson.

1. The look in your face

Reading emotions from facial expressions is a really useful skill. You are probably already pretty good at it, but you can get even better with practice.

Try this set of exercises:

1. Make some emotion cards. On one side of small bits of card or paper, write the word for different emotions, one emotion per card. Don't just stick with the obvious one anger, sadness, happiness, fear, also use surprise, disgust, contempt, triumph.

2. In pairs shuffle the cards and put them face down on the table between you. Take turns to pick up a card and make the face of the emotion that it says. Can your partner tell what your face says? Can you tell what their face says when it is their turn? Try this with your best friends and with people you don't know? Are you better at reading your friends or those you know less well?

3. Look at faces of people from other countries and races other than your own and practice reading the emotion in their expression.

This is your route to becoming a super empathiser!

FACIAL EXPRESSION READING TIPS

Look at the eyes - are the pupils (the black bit in the middle) big or small? Are the eyes moving about? Are the eyes narrowed or squinting? What are the eyelids and eyebrows doing?

Pay attention to the shape of the mouth...tense or relaxed, lips open or closed - there are lots of tiny clues you can read here when yo really start to look.

Noses too express emotion...tiny movements of the nostrils or whole nose wrinkling

2. Learning to be kinder: The New Girl

- Who is the narrator in the story?
- Why does she react to the New Girl unkindly? What do you think she feels?
- What do you think the New Girl feels when the children are unkind to her?
- Imagine what the new girl might say to her family at the end of each day?
- Why do you think the New Girl decides to react to the bullying in the way she does?
- What do the paper flowers do? Why and how do they change what everyone feels?

Every Child A Song, with illustrations by Marc Martin

A celebration of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child one of the most powerful piece of international law in the history of the United Nations.
