We aren't apologetic about how much it costs us to run the network. Supporting and inspiring action while meeting our legal and governance responsibilities takes investment.

We need £75,000 to cover our core delivery costs, including:

- Full cost recovery for a full-time officer;
- Support from a team of people working across the charity to provide management, finance, media, web and design services;
- Co-ordinating and training volunteers and managing PVG checks; and
- Covering staff and volunteer expenses, ensuring all participating groups are visited annually and able to attend training, events and meetings across Scotland.
